Re: Visitation during the pandemic

Dear Residents,

The Housing Authority of Kansas City, Kansas (KCKHA) is very concerned about your health and well-being during this pandemic crisis. Residents of the high-rise buildings will be expected to follow Governor Kelly's Executive Order 20-16:

1. To preserve the public health and safety for all Kansans, and to ensure the healthcare system is capable of serving all citizens in need, especially those at high risk and vulnerable to COVID-19, all individuals within the state of Kansas are directed to stay in their homes or residences unless performing an essential activity. Essential activities include:
 - a. Obtaining groceries, household necessities or medications
 - b. Receiving the services of a healthcare professional in the residence or at the doctor's office
 - c. Going to and from work classified as "essential"

Due to the fact that most of our residents are in the high-risk category for getting the virus and would have serious health consequences from being infected, no visitors will be allowed on the premises until the stay at home order is expired. We know this is a difficult request, but we must work together to keep both our residents and staff safe during the spread of the deadly COVID-19 virus.
